Three-Country Study Tour on Integrated Care

The Three Countries Study Tour of Scotland, Wales and England seeks to examine the leadership and management of integrated care innovations. The Study Tour will have a specific focus in the development of new models and approaches to care for older people with complex needs including the use of new technologies.

The Study Tour will also be an opportunity to learn from Reference Sites within the European Innovation Partnership in Active and Healthy Ageing (EIP-AHA) B3 Action Group on Integrated Care.

Key Learning Objectives

- Examine regional and country-level strategies that have established integrated health and social care authorities
- Investigate innovative models of integrated care providers that combine primary, community and hospital care
- Experience innovations in care management using population risk stratification and multi-disciplinary teams
- Understand how information technology and e-health records are used to support integrated care in practice
- Assess the barriers, facilitators and key drivers for integrated care at a regional and local level
- Reflect upon the influence of governance and financial incentives in the contracting and delivery of integration

Learning Style

Participants will learn through a combination of plenary lectures, observational analysis during site visits, and whole-group discussions with presenters and facilitators. During each visit, time will be put aside to build and establish understanding of the home-country's health and care system and the complexities of the political and organizational

context in which innovations in integrated care are being taken forward. Participants will be encouraged to take a critical appreciation of the systems, process and cultures that help and/or hinder efforts at closer integration between institutions and teams enabling transfer of appropriate knowledge and ideas.



Scotland has introduced ambitious legislation to integrate health and social care. 31 integration authorities are each using an integrated budget to commission support and services for their local communities. Innovations include local partnerships with housing, community, voluntary and independent sectors, investment in anticipatory care, hospital at home and intermediate care services, the use of technology to empower greater choice and control, post diagnostic support for dementia, self management network and fund, and a national focus on coproduction.

NHS Wales is focusing its service redesign on addressing 5 key challenges associated with care demand, sustainable workforce, whole-system efficiencies and value for money, collaborative partnership working, and self-management. Insights into how these challenges are being tackled from a rural perspective will be demonstrated through a team based approach in Powys supported by the Shropshire Doctors Cooperative Ltd, and Choose Pharmacy in North Wales.

In Powys, by working as a Team, staff who are closer to the patient access GP support and advice to make clinical decisions quickly. An advanced nurse practitioner or an advanced paramedic, known as Urgent Care Practitioners (UCP), is deployed to the patient's home from the primary care base. People living in North Wales are able to seek advice and treatment for common ailments from their local pharmacist rather than making a GP practice appointment.

The Greater Manchester region, serving 2.8million people, was the first region in England to benefit from the transfer of power from national government to local decision makers. In the midst of devolution and the combined health and social care budgets, the transformation of health and social care systems has accelerated in recent times.

- Site visits to Pennine Care, an integrated mental health and community services provider
- World café on innovations in integrated care across the North West of England with comparison to international experiences
- Discussions and reflections on learning from the region

Across the whole North West footprint it is possible to see radical changes and innovations in the formation of new care models. Systems and services continue to develop as new structures such as integrated care organisations and multispecialty community providers evolve and embed.
