



IFIC Scotland Webinar Series 5:

Background

IFIC's Self Management and Co-production Special Interest Group brought together a range of guest presenters from across Scotland, Wales and Ontario, Canada to explore 'Social Prescribing - Up Close and Personal or Physically Distanced?'

The theme that 'one size does not fit all' came through in the examples of service adaptability in delivery and responsiveness to people and community needs.

Clare Hurlin, Strategic Head Chronic Conditions Management, shared the ways in which they have adapted services due to COVID which sharing updates on local service and community support so that navigating systems and accessing information during the pandemic was simplified for people in the community.

Roseann Logan provided insight into the Community Links Worker Programme and the experiences of their Community Links Practitioners supporting communities across Glasgow during the COVID-19 pandemic

Lara Murray shared the learning from Scotland's Self Management Fund project reviews and learning from Covid through project adaptations. Challenges included projects dealing with increased mental health issues, increased isolation and loneliness, and barriers to digital access.

Prof Lorriane Closs and Stuart Muirhead shared their international co-production collaboration, reflecting that for co-production you 'need to double the time' as relationships are established and assets explored with rich examples shared.


Great morning of inspiration and insights
