It serves a population of over 660,000 people across urban and rural areas.</p> <p>One Gloucestershire Health & Wellbeing Partnership has recently developed and published an interim Integrated Care Strategy based on public engagement and discussion with wider stakeholders across Gloucestershire.</p> <p>This strategy is One Gloucestershire Health & Wellbeing Partnership's blueprint for delivering better health and care to and for the people of Gloucestershire. Building on existing strategy and partnerships, there is a clear focus on prevention, ensuring independence, resilience and equity through collaboration with our communities.</p>

In this session, we will explore these concepts through real-life examples.</p>

13.30 – 15.00	<p>How do we measure value in IC evaluation?</p> <p>An economic evaluation draws on information gathered as part of a process and impact evaluation to identify where value is created and where the cost and benefit measurement needs to be focussed. In this session, we will examine the goals of economic evaluation, key methods used, how to identify value, the associated measures, and potential data sources. We will also look at how evaluation results should be presented to complement wider evaluation findings.</p>
